Iodine

Definition of causal agent

At ambient temperature iodine is a dark grey, crystalline solid; heating produces a violet vapour

Main occupational uses and sources of exposure:

Manufacture of medicinal iodine-containing compounds for topical use; photographic processing.

Toxicity and irritancy

Irritant effects

- irritation of the upper and lower respiratory tracts

- irritation of the eyes with corneal staining

- irritation of the skin, chemical burns, staining

minimum intensity of exposure: well above 0.1ppm

minimum duration of exposure: immediate induction period: immediate

maximum latent period: a few minutes for acute irritant effects
